Role of District Superintendent

The CVES District Superintendent (DS) is responsible for serving both our BOCES and our component school districts, and to facilitate communication and work with the NYS Education Dept. as the Commissioner's representative in our region. The DS also takes a leadership role in supporting Board of Regents and NYSED priorities, advancing regional educational capacity, supporting diversity, equity, and inclusion, and supporting student achievement.

The DS works with the Boards of Education, Chief School Officers, and the CVES administrative team to promote and support quality-first instruction, successful implementation of NYS Standards, and organizational efficiencies across CVES and our component districts.

The DS also assists component school districts with Superintendent searches, supporting shared services, collaboration with community agencies, and facilitating communication among our component districts.

Board of Cooperative Educational Services

Each BOCES is governed by a Board of Cooperative Educational Services elected each year by our 16 component school districts' Boards of Education. The 15-member CVES Board is responsible for curricular, programmatic, financial, and other policy decisions, as are Boards at the local school districts.

CVES, also known as Clinton-Essex-Warren-Washington (CEWW) BOCES, was established in 1949 as a way for local school districts to collaborate on increasing the range of educational offerings while reducing each individual district's expenses and developing new initiatives for our region.

Value to Taxpayers

Our component school districts and taxpayers depend on CVES to be the regional leader in developing cost-effective and innovative shared educational programs. CVES helps its component school districts contain costs by supporting shared educational services through CVES Co-Sers, and by assisting them with non-instructional functions such as cooperative purchasing, communication and printing services, which may be partially funded through NYS BOCES Aid.
