

New Visions: Medical Careers (NVMC)

A competitive, application-based program for High School Seniors expressing an interest in a post-secondary educational experience in the Field of Healthcare. This rigorous one-year exploratory program is for select college-bound seniors planning to major in a field of study in Healthcare and/or related fields. Students are immersed in the Healthcare environment at UVM Elizabethtown Community Hospital and through clinical observations with business & industry partners in the field throughout the community. The program will incorporate dual enrollment in college and high school credit-bearing coursework with career exploration and Work-Based Learning (WBL) experiences in Healthcare. Students will participate in daily ½ day sessions for the course of the school year during the Senior Year. The purpose of this program is to increase student success with determining a college major and career pathway in the Field of Healthcare and/or related fields while completing dual high school and college credit-bearing coursework.
